INSTRUCTIONS

This self-study course is designed to present the basic teachings of the Christian faith. It covers both Bible knowledge and practical living. Scroll down to the Table of Contents to see the topics covered. The course may be used in at least five ways.

1. First, you may simply want to study on your own to increase your Bible knowledge.
2. Second, you may receive a certificate of completion from Newman Bible Academy. Each question is worth one point. The test is open book with no time limit. Use the text book and your Bible to look up the answers in the workbook. Below is the grading:

A -Excellent 630 points or more; B -Good 597—629 points; C -Average 512--596 points;
D -Below average 420--511 points; F -Failure 419 points or less, take the course over.
3. This course may be counted for credit at some Bible colleges or seminaries. It will count as one course toward a diploma from Newman Bible Academy. Faith Evangelical Seminary, Tacoma, WA, USA will accept up to 60 credit hours toward a B.A. in religion.
4. You can use this course for group Bible study and discipleship programs. I suggest you cover one lesson per week. One to two hours is enough for the discussion time. The participants should fill out the answers prior to the discussion. The leader can then ask the each participant what they put down for an answer, and then have the group discuss each question and answer. The participants can take turns answering the questions. It is important to stress, "What does the Bible actually say?" The group should not discuss what their theological viewpoints might be.
5. This course may be used in one-to-one follow-up discipleship study for new converts.

The text ebook for this course is Christian Foundations: Basic Teachings, by Dr. Willis C. Newman. You will also need your Bible. To receive a certificate or credit from Newman Bible Academy, simply type out your answers to the questions on a Microsoft Word Document, and then email them by attachment to drwillisnewman@gmail.com. All answers can be found in the text ebook or the Bible verses listed by a question. There are fill in the blank, matching, and true & false questions. Wait until you have completed the entire workbook, and email all your answers in one document.

It is suggested that you first read the text book chapter for each lesson, then go back a second

time to answer the questions. Find a quiet place where you will not be disturbed. Pray and ask God to help you find and understand the answers to the questions. You can take short breaks now and then, or to lay the test aside and come back to it later. Reflect on the questions. It is important to write the answers based on what the Bible text actually says. For the true and false statements, answer whether or not the actual statement is true or false.

Below is an example of how to type out your answer sheet to email. It contains the first five questions on lesson one in the workbook. First, read the whole chapter in the text ebook, go back and read the question in the workbook, look up the answer, type it in a Word document as below, and then email it by attachment to drwillisnewman@gmail.com.



HOW TO BE SAVED

The Bible gives us the message (gospel) of how to be saved. By this we mean how to gain forgiveness for our sin and how to gain eternal life. Summarized below are the steps for salvation as presented in the Bible. We invite you to receive Christ as your Saviour and Lord.

1. Agree in your heart with God that you are a sinner in need of His salvation: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Romans 3:23).

2. Know in your heart that there is a penalty to your sin: "For the wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23a).

3. Believe in your heart that Christ died on the cross and rose from the dead to pay the penalty for your sins and to give you eternal life:

"But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

"being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus" Romans 3:24).

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

"but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23a).

4. By faith receive Christ as your personal Saviour. Pray to God. Tell Him you believe the above in your heart and ask Him to save you through Jesus Christ. Remember that God is more concerned with the attitude of your heart rather than your exact words.

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, that no one would boast" (Ephesians 2:8,9).

"if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you shall be saved; for with the heart man believes, resulting in righteousness, and with the mouth he confesses resulting in salvation" (Romans 10:9,10).

"Behold, I (Jesus) stand at the door (of your heart) and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with Me"(Revelation 3:20).

"But as many as received Him (Jesus), to them He gave the right to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:12,13).

The following is a suggested prayer:

Heavenly Father, I admit to you that I am a sinner in need of your salvation. I believe that Christ died on the cross and rose from the dead to pay for my sins and to give me eternal life. I believe that only through Christ can I be saved. I ask for and accept by faith your free gift of salvation. Please come into my heart and be my Saviour and Lord. Thank you for doing so. In Jesus' name, amen.

When we are born again, we still have the old sin nature, but we also have been given a new nature, or capacity. We also have the Holy Spirit who lives within us. There is a constant war between our old and new nature, with the Holy Spirit giving us the power and desire to live for God. The power of the old nature has been broken (cf. Romans 6:11-14). The major means the Holy Spirit uses to fortify our lives is the Bible, by which we "renew" our minds.

One must keep in mind two conditions of the Christian. First, our position is that of a child of God. This is permanent, like the relationship between any father and son. Second, when Christian's sin, they lose fellowship, joy, power, usefulness and bring shame to God. To restore the fellowship we must confess and forsake our sins (1 John 1:9; Proverbs 28:13). This does not save us again, but simply restores our fellowship with our heavenly Father.
